The Ejido La Ciudad spans 13,794 hectares, with 11,235 actively managed in the Sierra Madre Occidental. It functions as a vital biological corridor connecting the Pacific lowlands. Its coniferous and broadleaf forests are crucial for carbon sequestration, water conservation, and biodiversity protection. Located between the Baluarte and Presidio basins, the ejido provides high-quality water runoff to Nayarit and Sinaloa, and lies along the Central Flyway. With 243 landowners, Ejido La Ciudad is a community-led model of sustainable land use, balancing timber production with conservation. FSC-certified. Supporting this project means investing in climate action, water security, and community empowerment, ensuring a resilient future for both people and nature.

This 100-year Improved Forest Management (IFM) enhances carbon sequestration and ecosystem resilience through sustainable forestry. It covers 153,202 hectares (145,346 actively managed) of FSC-certified pine and oak forests. The project is led by the Indigenous Tepehuano community, Au Dam ("Man of the Mountains"), a national benchmark for sustainable management. The land is communally owned by 1,148 people and supports 6,000 inhabitants. The property includes Cerro Gordo, Durango's highest peak (3,430 meters). Considered sacred, it is believed to be home to "the chief, the one who makes it rain." It also serves as a key pilgrimage site for the Wixárika, Náayeri, Tepehuano, and Mexikan peoples.
