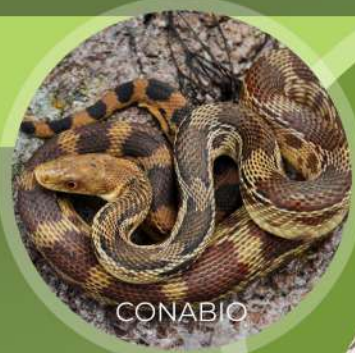

participation of women and youth.
